RALPH M. BROWN ACT

54954.2. (a) At least 72 hours before a regular meeting, the legislative body of the local agency, or its designee, shall post an agenda containing a brief general description of each item of business to be transacted or discussed at the 5 meeting, including items to be discussed in closed session. A brief general description of an item generally need not exceed 20 words. The agenda shall specify the time and location of the regular meeting and shall be posted in a location that is freely accessible to members of the public. If requested, the agenda shall be made available inappropriate alternative formats to persons with a disability, as required by Section 202 of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 12132), and the federal rules and regulations adopted in implementation thereof. The agenda shall include information regarding how, to whom, and when a request for disability-related modification or accommodation, including auxiliary aids or services may be made by a person with a disability who requires a modification or accommodation in order to participate in the public meeting.

REMOVAL WARNING

NHS respectfully requests \$1,000 to support an upcoming Neighborhood Pride day event in Los Angeles. Organized as part of our ongoing community outreach and revitalization programming, Neighborhood Pride Day brings together dozens of volunteers and makes land, street and property clean ups in target neighborhoods throughout LA County. Major expenses include clean-up materials and supplies, printing, vehicle rental, refreshments staff coordination and event promotion. After the improvement work is completed, NHS surveys residents and community leaders for demographic and economic data to help us better serve community needs. We host Pride Day events several times a year. Beyond the direct benefits of property improvement, community clean-up, & volunteer opportunities. The event will contribute to creating community leaders and provide outreach for neighborhood groups while facilitating valuable partnerships & promoting sustainability.

Some neighborhoods have installed community gardens as a response to Pride Day. Volunteers are also encouraged to involve their employers, friends and neighborhood networks for future events. As we connect with the community in a deeper, more meaningful way, we all move closer to achieving the vision for "true community" that neighbors wish to see.


